Flood Recovery Update

May 2022

Supporting flood-impacted schools

The NSW Department of Education is coordinating an emergency response effort that is unprecedented in terms of scale and impact. A large number of schools in the Northern Rivers region have damage to either the entire site or some buildings and facilities.

What is happening at Lismore South Public School?

The whole of Lismore South Public School, including most second-storey spaces, were impacted by flood waters. The Lismore South Public School Ngulliboo Jarjums Preschool was also inundated with water. The site is still closed for cleaning and remediation.

Due to the extent of damage, students will continue to learn from Goonellabah Public School until the temporary “pop-up” school on the Lismore South Public School grounds is complete.

Current status

- The Lismore South Public School site has been made safe. The school has been cleaned, walls and classrooms have been stripped out and the site has been secured.
- Planning is underway to rebuild Lismore South Public School to cater for the future learning and teaching needs of the school community.
- Work has started to put a temporary, pop-up school on the Lismore South Public School grounds.
- The pop-up school will include teaching and learning spaces, a canteen, a library, toilets, administration office and out of school hours care (OSHC) facilities. A separate temporary building will be provided for the preschool.

Next steps

Planning and due diligence is underway to understand the scope of work required at the school site to meet local needs for permanent education infrastructure.

School Infrastructure NSW will hold a school community information session for the Lismore South Public School community in coming weeks. The information session will provide the community with updates on the extent of damage at the school, options for repair and replacement of buildings on the site, and future community engagement activities.

What else is happening in the region?

The local School Infrastructure NSW office has inspected all schools in flood-impacted areas and has removed rubbish, cleaned and secured affected sites to ensure they are safe. Teams are repairing and remediating schools that were damaged during the floods and assessing works needed to rebuild the worst affected schools.

Where possible, students are learning at their usual school sites, while some schools have been relocated to alternative sites so that their learning can continue while school repairs or rebuild works are underway.
